Electric Road on the Bay

North Bend Harbor: The Marshfield Electric Light Company has made application to the council of Empire for a franchise to run its wires into that town. It is believed that this marks the beginning of a greater development in this line on the peninsula.
The North Bend Power Company, through its representative, F. M. Friedberg, has made application to the town council of Marshfield for the sale of electricity within the limits of the incorporation.
It is understood that this is part of a general plan to extend the business of this company. It also includes the possibility of furnishing power for an electric street car line.
It is probable that the North Bend Power Company and Messrs F. B. Waite and J. N. Shahan will co-operate in the matter of building a street car line between Marshfield and North Bend. A separate franchise will be required for the car line.
The North Bend Power Company will soon begin the erection of its new plant at the Porter mill. It will also extend its pole line into Marshfield and be prepared to furnish light and power to those who may wish to patronize it.
