Articles of incorporation were filed with the county clerk in Roseburg this morning by the Roseburg Rochdale Association (the co-operative company). The capital stock is placed at \$5000, divided into 100 shares at \$50 each. The incorporators are Robt. Robertson, W. F. Anderson, F. A. McCall, C. W. Martyn and F. E. Cavender. The company has leased the old postoffice quarters in the Abraham building and expects to open for business with a line of groceries about May 15. A manager for the store has not yet been selected.
