If the two fleets come together each with its full complement of ships, the weight of powder and steel that can be hurled against the opponent is in favor of Admiral Togo. The Russians have more battleships, but the Japs have more armored cruisers.

The following table of the number of guns in each fleet has been compiled by the navy department:

Another condition considered greatly in favor of the Japanese is the experience of the personnel of the various ships and the service their ships have seen. The Washington Post has it that at least four of the Russian battleships are now, and their faults have never been found, unless Rojstevsky discovered them while in the Indian ocean. On the other hand, the Japanese have been fighting with their warships for over a year, and have undoubtedly seen all of their weak points and corrected them.

The outcome of the battle, if battle there finally be, is awaited with great interest by the entire world.

Mining on South Myrtle.

At the Continental mine, 12 miles from the town of Myrtle Creek, there are now about 1,000 feet of tunnel and shafts already completed. There are ten men employed, working two shifts daily, who have sunk a shaft striking the main tunnel 110 feet below the surface, 300 feet from the entrance of the tunnel and are sinking another 100 feet. The shaft is twelve feet in diameter. There are 100 tons of ore sacked and ready for shipment, which will begin in a few weeks. This assay from \$100.00 to \$800.00 a ton. On the dump there are about 20,000 tons of ore which will assay over \$20.00 a ton. Recently one button was assayed that went \$10,000 to the ton.

About the first of May the hauling will begin, the ore will be stored near the depot and shipped in train-load lots. A few weeks later a 50 ton mill will be erected on the premises, and so on until every improvement that a good, paying mine is in need of, has been added at the Continental.

Manager Stewart has added \$500.00 to the road fund and has many men working thereon, and very soon that section will have one of the best county roads in the state.—Mail.

New W. O. W. Officers.

LOS ANGELES, April 22.—The Pacific division of Woodmen of the World today elected officers for the ensuing year. I. I. Boak, of Denver, was chosen head consul; P. E. Soodgrass, Eugene, Ore., head banker; F. P. Bertschey, Denver, Colo., head auditor; Dr. T. A. Hughes, Denver, head physician. There were but three head managers to elect, Messrs A. D. Stillman, of Pendleton, Ore., and C. V. Benson, of Loveland, Colo., holding over. The following were elected. T. M. Robinson, of Oakland, Cal., W. C. Hawley, of Salem, Ore., and Dr. James Stenhouse, of Denver.

Elmer F. Conner, of Seattle, Wash., was elected as head escort while the election for head watchman resulted in the selection of A. Argall, of Everett, Wash., and that of head sentry fell to Charles O'Connor, of Salt Lake, Utah. The matter of fixing salaries of head managers brought about considerable discussion, finally resulting in members of the board, not members of the finance committee being allowed a salary of \$800 and those who are members of the finance committee a salary of \$1200. Compensation of the head physician was fixed at \$25 for each application acted upon. "These salaries shall be full compensation for all services rendered to the order, and that no per diem be allowed except to head consul as heretofore provided."

Train Wrecker Again Caught.

SALEM, April 23.—Superintendent C. W. James, of the penitentiary, received a message from the chief of police of Lewiston, Idaho, yesterday notifying him that one George Richardson had been arrested over there and asking if such a man was wanted here. Richardson made his escape from the prison here in 1899 while serving a term of years for wrecking a train at Rice Hill in Southern Oregon. No trace of him has since been heard until yesterday, when the telegram was received from Lewiston. Superintendent James notified the chief of police of Lewiston of the facts and advised him to hold Richardson. It is quite probable that he will be brought back here without the use of a requisition.
