Russians Will Double Track Siberian R. R.

FLEET IS AGAIN SIGHTED

Reported Forty Miles North of Kamranh Bay—Another Riot in Warsaw.

BIRMINGHAM, England, May 1.—The Post today states that two Russian government agents sailed Saturday for America to purchase 40,000 tons of steel rails for double tracking the trans-Siberian railway.

RUSSIAN FLEET SIGHTED.

SAIGON, May 1.—The Russian Baltic fleet is lying off Port Dagal, 40 miles north of Kamranh bay. A French squadron has been mobilized in order to enforce neutrality.

TROUBLE IN WARSAW.

LONDON, May 1.—A dispatch from Warsaw says a conflict between citizens and troops there this afternoon resulted in 60 casualties. More bloodshed may follow.

For California Electrical Units.

Strong hopes are entertained that international uniformity in electrical units may shortly be secured. Our foreign office has the matter under consideration on the report of experts who attended the St. Louis electrical congress. In all likelihood an international commission, which it is suggested should arrange such a system of electrical units—in terms of the ohm, volt and ampere—will foregather at Geneva or The Hague. In many countries, including Russia, Norway and Sweden, Denmark, the Netherlands, Portugal, Italy and Japan, no electrical units have yet been legalized.—London Telegraph.

GEN. FITZHUGH LEE DEAD.

Famous Virginian Succumbed at Washington Friday Night.

WASHINGTON, April 29.—General Fitzhugh Lee, who was stricken on a train enroute to Washington yesterday, sank steadily during the evening, and died about 11 o'clock last night. None of his family was present at the bedside.

(Fitzhugh Lee was a nephew of General Robert E. Lee and was born in Fairfax county, Virginia in 1835, graduated from West Point in 1858, joined the cavalry service in Confederate army in 1861. In 1896 he was appointed consul general at Havana by President Cleveland. In 1899 he was appointed major-general of volunteers in command of the 7th corps and was stationed at Tampa, Florida. His command took no part in the Cuban war, but when peace was declared he returned to Cuba as military governor of the province and city of Havana.

A widow and five children survive General Lee.)

Mr. F. J. Blakely returned this morning from an extended absence in the east. He reports the country in a very prosperous condition and plenty of capital is ready for investments on this coast if a proper showing of existing conditions can be made.

For the benefit of the patrons of the Wilbur postoffice and the rural delivery mail route from there, mail is now delivered at Wilbur by the south-bound overland train. Mail from Roseburg and points south is exchanged from one train to the other at Drain giving a complete early morning service. This brings the Roseburg papers to subscribers there one day earlier than heretofore.

The semi-annual report of County Clerk Z. N. Agee, published in today's Review, is one of the most complete documents of the kind issued from that office for a long time. A thorough abstract of all the outstanding county warrants has been made, and the actual interest computed thereon up to April 1, 1905. For a number of years past, the amount of outstanding warrants and interest have been merely approximated, and as a result of such loose methods there had grown to be a wide discrepancy in the figures and what was the actual condition. On the first of last July the estimate was cut down \$30,000, and it was found upon making the recent abstract, that it was still a little too high. The people of Douglas county are to be congratulated upon having so careful, obliging and competent a clerk as Mr. Agee to attend their public business.

H. W. Miller Pleads Guilty to Land Frauds.

SENTENCE IS SUSPENDED

By Judge Bellinger in the Federal Court in Portland—County Grand Jury.

PORTLAND, May 1.—In the Federal court this morning, Henry W. Miller, under indictment for subornation of perjury in connection with land frauds in Southern Oregon, changed his former plea of not guilty to that of guilty. Sentence was suspended by Judge Bellinger. Miller is under indictment on a similar charge in California.

The county grand jury convened today to investigate the municipal scandals and charges of graft preferred against the city councilmen of Portland.
