Elhu Root, as secretary of state, will be a worthy successor to John Hay, and may even recall the strenuous days of Richard Olney.

They are going to try Geo. C. Brownell for subornation of perjury. The Clackamas county statesman probably told a lie—he couldn't help it—and then got some poor fool to swear to it.

The Oregonian insults the Order of Elks for the purpose of giving Governor Chamberlain a slap. No occupant of the executive chair has devoted more time to public business or stuck closer to his duties than the present incumbent, and yet the grouchy old fossil in the Oregonian editorial chair begrudges him a short vacation East to mingle with his brother members of a great fraternal order. Instances of this kind only emphasize the narrowness of a newspaper.

The erecting of statues of Lewis and Clark and Sacajawea at the Portland exposition is all well enough, but it should be borne in mind that those actors in the great drama of one hundred years ago were only playing subordinate parts. Thomas Jefferson alone conceived the expedition whose wonderful results are being commemorated, and his was the master mind that executed it through such instruments as Lewis and Clark and their assistants.

The limit of the idiosyncrasy displayed in the enactment of laws seems never reached. No matter how glaring a case may be it is safe to count upon its being exceeded by some subsequent aggregation of legislators. The latest and worst ever comes to light in perusing the new Portland charter, which gives the mayor of that city authority, not the power, to suppress gambling even four miles outside the corporate limits. Probably a more ridiculous enactment was never incorporated in any charter, but it gave the garrulous old Oregonian an opportunity to call upon Mayor Lane to send his policemen out to Milwaukee (in Clackamas county) and suppress the game that is running openly there. Of course, the Oregonian mainly desired to embarrass the new mayor, but he very sensibly paid no attention to it, and Attorney General Crawford, to whom the question was referred by some one, passed it up as too silly to seriously consider.
