Pittsburg and Steel.

Another steel plant at Pittsburg, starting out with a backing of \$15,000,000, likely to run up into the hundreds of millions as time goes on, will serve to render that city more than ever the iron and steel capital of the world. A syndicate of its business men has just paid \$1,500,000 for 600 acres of land near Allegrappa, on the Ohio, about fifteen miles from the city, and the work is to be carried forward with a rush.
