## GOOD ROADS AND SCHOOLS.

Value of the Farmer as an Aid to Education.

In line with the suggestion recently advanced by George H. Maxwell, director of the National Irrigation association, for a union of effort among the leaders of the good roads, irrigation, educational, forestry and similar movements comes an argument put forth by the United States bureau of education illustrating the interdependence of these causes, says the Good Roads Magazine.

It is stated that "one of the most important problems for our rural communities has been how best to secure the benefits of a graded school system so as to enable the farmer to give his children instruction in the higher branches of learning without leaving the farm," and reports are given showing that the experiment of transporting pupils at public expense to a central school has been tried in twenty-two of the states. The advantages attained by this plan are shown to be many and important.

The successful operation of the system depends, however, on a system of good roads as a first principle.

One of the first points regarded by a farmer in selecting a home is his proximity to the schoolhouse, but, though it may not be very distant "as the crow flies," if the roads are impassable for a large part of the school year his children do not profit by the advantage.

Bad roads are limitations on a farmer's liberty—bars to his prison—shutting him and his family away from schools, churches and neighbors, as well as from markets. How long will intelligent and liberty loving men tolerate such restrictions, and how long will educators hold aloof from the support of a movement which is of primary importance to the success of their efforts?
