In Justice Long's court this morning two transients, H. Winters and E. Murphy, were given an examination on a charge of larceny, and dismissed for want of sufficient evidence to hold them to the circuit court. The defendants were accused of stealing a purse, containing about \$25 in money and some other valuables, from Edyth Watson, who conducts the dive in the rear of the old Cruiser saloon.
