CITY OF EUGENE SUE.

Petition to Restrain Council From Issuing Water & Light Bonds.

EUGENE, Or., Dec. 19.—The expected suit against the city council to restrain it from issuing the \$200,000 light and water bonds for municipal plants, was filed yesterday afternoon by Woodcock & Potter, representing James F. Robinson. Mr. Robinson was manager of the electric light plant here before Rhodes, Sinkler & Butcher purchased it, and it is said that he appears as plaintiff in the suit.

The grounds for asking the injunction are as follows: That the election at which the bonds were voted was illegal and void because the resolution of the city council ordering the election, the published notice of election, and the ballots used at the election required the voters to vote upon two propositions and questions at the same time without being separated. That on account of the resolution, notice and ballots, the voters were prevented from expressing their will or desire on the questions submitted. That the action of the council providing for only one voting place was fraudulent to prevent many voters from having an opportunity to vote, and did prevent a large number from doing so.

19.—W. B. Dunne, attorney for the estate of Senator Mitchell, appeared today in the Oregon supreme court and asked leave to file an original bill in equity against the secretary of the interior and commissioner of the general land office. The primary object of the bill, which is quite voluminous, is threefold: First, to require an answer by the secretary and commissioner; second, to enjoin and restrain the secretary and commissioner from allotting to any Indian or other person any lands selected and designated by the State of Oregon in swamp list 82; and, third, asking the court by its decree to declare that title of United States to all lands included within the Klamath Indian reservation, which were on March 12, 1860, swamp and overflowed lands, passed to and became the property of the State of Oregon by reason of such act, and that title to such lands is now in the state, subject only to such right of temporary occupation as may exist in Indians at present occupying or inhabiting the said reservation and not subject to be defeated by any allotment, patent or agreement or other arrangement having the effect of making occupancy permanent to other parties.

D. M. Dunne Appointed Admr. Estate of Senator Mitchell.

PORTLAND, Or., Dec. 19.—Petition for the appointment of Colonel David M. Dunne, as administrator of the estate of Senator Mitchell, was filed in the county court this afternoon. The estate is valued at less than \$2000, and consists of an undivided one-half interest in seven lots in Holladay Addition and personal effects.

The petition asks for the appointment of Colonel Dunne as administrator de bonis non, with the will annexed, in the estate of John B. Price, valued at \$25,000.

Senator Mitchell also held in trust the estate of George A. Price, which in lands and notes is valued at \$20,000. Colonel Dunne was appointed.
