TIRED OF PROHIBITION.

Recent Election in Georgia Shows Trend of Sentiment.

ATLANTA, Ga., June 15.—The sentiment is rapidly gaining headway here that the defeat of Governor Hoke Smith in the primary was practically a demonstration against the prohibition law. So strong is its feeling, that some of the legislators have indicated that they will support a movement to repeal it. Representative W. W. Wilson of Gaynesville today said:

"The very day the legislature convenes this summer I am going to introduce a bill to repeal the prohibition law, although I supported the original measure."

The victory of Joseph M. Brown over Governor Hoke Smith is regarded as the death knell of prohibition in Georgia.

EUGENE GETS 2ND CANNERY.

EUGENE, Or., June 15.—Eugene is to have another big cannery and fruit dryer next year. C. B. Bussel, president; W. Lair Hill, attorney; and J. B. Moran, general superintendent of the Weber-Bussel canning company, of Seattle, are here today to secure a suitable location for their big cannery, which they say will be in running order before next year's fruit season.

The cannery will have a capacity of 30,000 to 40,000 cans a season, and will employ a large force of workers. The cannery will be enlarged as demanded. The Weber-Bussel company has plants at Newberg and Prosser, Oregon, North Yakima and Puyallup, Washington.

NO OFFERS FROM EAST.

Oregon Growers Buyers not Contracting With Growers.

SALLEM, Or., June 14.—Salem prune packers have thus far had no inquiry from the East for prunes on the 1908 crop and they are making no offers. Neither are the packers trying to make contracts with growers. Both J. S. Gile & Co. and Tilson & Co. take the view that it is worse than useless to quote prices when there is no demand.

"Eastern buyers are not interested and if we quote prices now we would have difficulty in raising them later, while the jobbers would expect us to lower them," said H. S. Gile today. "The crop in the Northwest is short, amounting to about one-third, or at the outside one-half of last year's crop. The situation is, therefore, favorable so far as prices are concerned. Of course, so long as we are not selling we cannot buy and here is no contracting with growers yet."

At this time last year over half the prune crop of the Northwest had been sold on contracts made by growers with packers. Growers this year are content to wait, for their prunes are small, anyway, and they do not fear fluctuating values after the market opens. The only condition that appears unfavorable to prunes prices is the large crop of other fruits in California that are dried and sold in competition with prunes.
