S. F. LAND LOCATORS HIT.

Attorney General Crawford Gives an Opinion—Jury Investigating.

GALEM, Or., June 16.—People own every other part of the United States as well as from every section of the state of Oregon continue to write the attorney-general for advice regarding the possibility of acquiring a prior claim to quarter sections in the Oregon & California land grant.

Timber sharps are offering to lease anybody on a quarter-section of this valuable land for all kinds of prices, and many people are biting.

The people must learn that no attorney or timber cruiser or company of either," says Attorney General Crawford, "can locate any person on a quarter-section of this grant for either \$50 or \$500."

A recent communication has come from Minneapolis from a man who says a company there has offered to lease him on a claim in the Oregon & California grant for \$50, and that no government is able to reclaim the land he will have a prior claim on the section upon which he, has been located.

Added to the letter is the phrase, in the handwriting of the correspondent, "Minneapolis makes good." The attorney general remarked that it is no wonder they make good in Minneapolis if all are as enterprising as the firm of timber sharps who for \$50 will give any person a prior claim to valuable timber, the ownership of which is now vested in the Southern Pacific in western Oregon.

Federal Jury Proving. PORTLAND, Or., June 16.—The United States grand jury resumed its session this morning after a three-day recess. It is probable that the work of this body of men, which has not been in session a month, will be completed some time during the week.

The investigations now being made by the grand jury are with reference to the work of certain individuals in several parts of the state who it is claimed advertised to secure locations for parties seeking land. The conditions were that should their clients make filings with the respective county clerks on land now held by the Oregon & California grant would be given a preference in the final decision of the land grant, and in favor of the government. These men, it seems, have been charging for their work and the investigation is to determine whether the scheme violates any of the postal regulations.

OUTPUT OF COAL IN 1907.

California and Oregon Only States Showing Decrease.

WASHINGTON, June 17.—Practically complete returns to Mr. Edward W. Parker, statistician in charge of the division of mineral resources, United States Geological Survey, show that the production of coal in the United States during 1907 not only far exceeded any previous records in the history of the industry, but also exceeded by a considerable amount all previous estimates of the total output for that year.

The aggregate production of anthracite and bituminous coal in 1907 amounted to 480,450,042 short tons, valued at \$614,831,549, against \$14,157,278 short tons, valued at \$113,079,899, in 1906. The increase in production in 1907 over 1906 was 66,292,764 short tons, or 16.01 per cent, in quantity, and \$101,751,740, or 19.83 per cent, in value.

Pennsylvania Anthracite. Of this large production in 1907, 76,432,421 long tons, or 85,604,312 short tons, were anthracite coal from Pennsylvania. In 1906 the production of Pennsylvania anthracite was 63,645,010 long tons, or 71,282,411 short tons, valued at \$141,917,694 that the increase in the production of hard coal in 1907 amounted to 12,787,411 long tons, or 14,321,901 short tons, with an increase in value of \$31,666,362.

Bituminous Coal. The total production of bituminous coal in 1907 was 394,845,730 short tons, valued at \$451,247,493, an increase over 1906, when the production amounted to 342,874,867 short tons, of 51,970,863 short tons, or 15.16 per cent. The value of the bituminous production increased from \$81,162,115 in 1906 to \$451,247,493 in 1907, a gain of \$70,085,378, or 18.39 per cent.

DUTY OF LEGISLATURE.

Judge Benson Says Chamberlain Should be Elected.

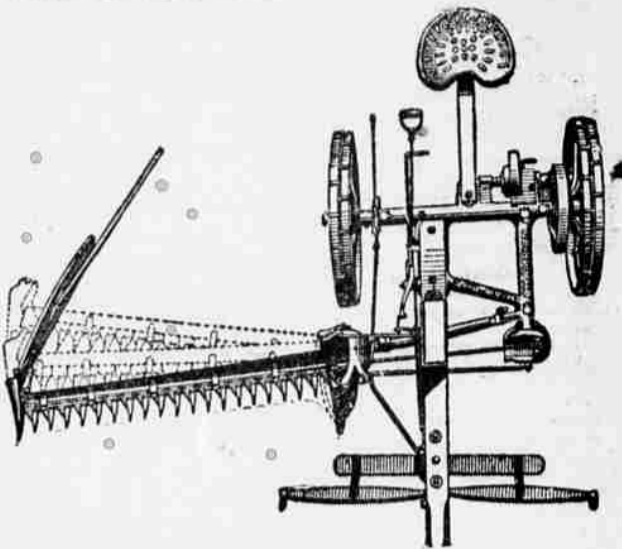
