**GROWTH OF OREGON K. OF P.**

Now Has 6,000 Members and \$68,490 in Its Treasury.

PORTLAND, Or., June 16.—From nine subordinate lodges, with a total membership of 419, in 1881, to 103 lodges, with a total membership of 6,000 in 1908, has been the tremendous growth of the Knights of Pythias in Oregon since the inception of the grand lodge 27 years ago. Equally as interesting is the fact that the finances of the fraternal organization have increased at a corresponding ratio, the balance on hand in 1881 being \$2803, while at the opening of the present year the grand master of exchequer had \$68,302 in his possession.

These facts were presented to the 400 delegates of the order at the twenty-seventh annual convention of the grand lodge which convened in Pythian Castle, Eleventh and Alder streets, this morning in the report of Grand Keeper of Records and Seal L. R. Stinson.

Owing to the serious illness of Grand Chancellor commander John M. Wall, Vice Grand Chancellor Gus C. Moser presided. Moser is certain of being unanimously elected to the highest title in the gift of the grand lodge, but there is a contest on for grand prelate and grand vice-chancellor. Walter B. Meacham seems to be the logical candidate for the fraternal chair, and there is no formidable opposition to him.

For vice-chancellor, however, Frank Menefee, of The Dalles; Walter Griffin, of Eugene, and John Howard, of Cottage Grove, have entered the race, and it is a toss-up which of the trio will secure the plum.

All arrangements have been completed for the grand banquet and ball to be given by Abduhl-Atter temple, No. 117, Dramatic Order Knights of Pythias, tomorrow night. The spread will take place at the Commercial Club at 8 o'clock and at 9 p. m. 50 tyros will be initiated into the mysteries of the order at Pythian Castle.

**TANANA CLEAN-UP \$15,000,000.**

SEATTLE, Wash., June 16.—The spring clean-up in Tanana district will exceed all expectations and may reach \$15,000,000, says a letter that has been received here from Falcon Joslyn, president of the Tanana railroad. Last year what is technically known as the Tanana country produced approximately \$8,000,000 in gold, and Joslyn estimated that the same country would turn out about \$12,000,000 this year.
