## HINTS FOR FARMERS

**For the Swine Breeder.**  
Following are ten commandments from the National Stockman that should be obeyed by every intelligent swine breeder:  
1. Breed from mature stock.  
2. See that they have dry, clean sleeping quarters.  
3. See that they are never overfed and no sudden changes made in their feed.  
4. See that they have free access to pure water.  
5. See that they have good shade during the warm weather.  
6. See that they are not confined to their feed in the winter, what is left over in the stall.  
7. Never feed an excessive corn diet.  
8. Do not injure.  
9. See that their surroundings are kept clean.  
10. In warm weather, dust their flanks around any place that are apt to give off a stench.

**The Young Horse.**  
One thing the young horse should never know is that there is a load in the world which he cannot pull. Horses are made to be born, and to grow up to be strong, and to make a career of it. This habit, like other bad habits, is hard to remedy, and every one owning a horse knows the disadvantages connected with it. No such care cannot be taken to develop a young horse. Overload at first heavier than the horse can pull, and this horse should always be a reliable puller. Young horses, I think, should be broken double before being single. After a horse is thoroughly broken double there is seldom any trouble to break him to drive singly. All young horses should be broken to drive single, as this is a market requirement.

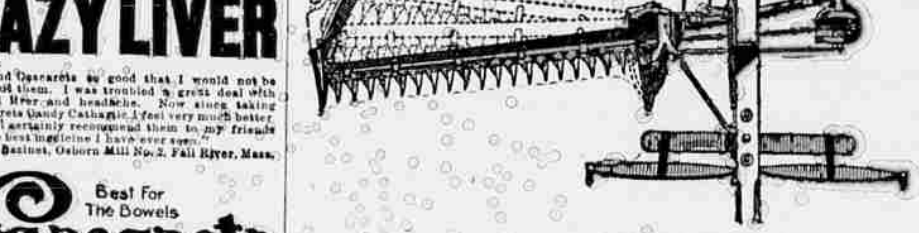
