The arrangement is to have First street lighted with one thousand and incandescent lights starting from Lyon street to Washington street, crossing at the intersection of the streets, the lights being about three feet apart. This would make a display which would attract wide attention and be a splendid boost for the city. The cost would be \$30 a month, not to exceed \$1 for each business man along the street. The lights would run until midnight. There is also talk among Second street people of being in the electric display again.

The fourteen-year-old daughter of Frank Morgan was shot by some one while standing at the door of her home, northeast of town, last Saturday evening. The bullet passed through the fleshy part of one of her limbs making a serious wound, but she is fast recovering under the care of Dr. F. J. Laird. The shooting is said to have been done by a neighbor boy, Lewis Williams, the ten-year-old son of A. G. Williams. It is said that a number of shots were fired at the house, one or more of which went through a window, and the girl went to the door to see where the shots were coming from when she was hit. The affair has not yet been investigated by the authorities, but probably will be soon when it will be learned who fired the shots and with what intent. Trouble is said to exist between the Williams family and two of the neighbor families, Morgan's and W. Alexander's. A bullet from the same gun—a 22 rifle—was said to have passed very close to the face of Rose Morgan, the same day the Morgan girl was shot.—Lebanon Express-Advocate.
