REV. REUTER HONORED.
Given M. A. Degree by Wesleyan University, Illinois.
Madford 1004 Mail; Rev. W. C. Reuter, the pastor of the B. Street Methodist church in this city, has received from the Wesleyan university, Bloomington, Ill., his diploma, informing him that that institution had conferred on him the degree of master of arts. That university grants no honorary degrees. Mr. Reuter worked several years for this degree. The honorands of the examinations may be seen from the fact that Rev. Mr. Reuter wrote three and one-half hours on Janet's "Final Causes." He wrote four and one-half hours on Bushnell's "Nature and the Supernatural," and seven hours on "The Philosophical Basis of Theism," by Harris. And these three books constitute only a small part of the books in which examination papers had to be written. Besides two diplomas from the Illinois Wesleyan university, Rev. Mr. Reuter also carries a diploma from Garrett Biblical Institute, Evanston, Ill., near Chicago, a Methodist-theological institution.
