PORTLAND, Or., June 25.—The annual rifle and revolver competition of the Oregon National Guard will be held on the rifle range near Salem during the week of July 20 to 24 inclusive. General orders No. 9, from the office of Adjutant-General W. E. Finzer, just issued, gives full instructions to regimental, battalion and company officers as to how the competing guardsmen are to be selected, as well as a complete program of the four days' shoot. The commanding officer of each regiment will send a team of four men and one alternate to be selected from the regimental and battalion commissioned and non-commissioned officers; from each company a team of four men and one alternate to be selected by the company commander. All to be selected by previous competition on some outdoor range in such manner as each commanding officer may deem necessary to secure the best shot of his command for his team. No guardsmen will be allowed to participate in the state contest unless he shall have performed not less than 75 per cent of all military duty since joining the national guard.

The following marksmanship contests will take place during the four days' competition:

State trophy match—Company championship; prize, silver cup to become the property of the organization winning it three times, not necessarily in succession.

State medal match—Competing for state trophy; prize, a gold medal to become the property of the officer or soldier winning it three times, not necessarily in succession. The highest individual score in the state trophy match will be awarded the prize in this contest.

State individual match—Open to all members of the national guard competing for the state trophy; prizes, (1) gold medal, two silver medals, five bronze medals and a silver medal to be awarded to the following: The guardsman making the highest aggregate score in slow fire, the one making the highest score in rapid fire and to the one making the highest score in skirmish fire.

Governor's trophy match—Regimental championship, open to teams of 8 men from each regimental organization in the state. This trophy is to be competed for annually.

State pistol match—Open to all commissioned officers of the national guard and to all non-commissioned officers present on the range during the state competitions; prizes, a gold medal to the competitor making the highest aggregate score, and a silver medal to each of the two competitors making the highest aggregate scores after the gold medal scores.

At the same time of the national guard shoot the annual matches of the Oregon branch of the National Rifle Association will be held on the same range. There will be two principal events, the trophy match and the national marksmen's reserve match. The usual rules will cover the two events.

The distance of fire, as shown by General Finzer's orders, will be 200 yards rapid fire, and 300 and 1000 yards slow fire. Ten shots will be

fired at 200 rapid, and the same at the other ranges plus two sighting shots. The team making the highest aggregate total will receive the Governor's trophy.

Scores made at Salem will be considered in the selecting of the team which will represent Oregon this year in the National Rifle competition on the south shore of Lake Erie. Eighteen men will be sent, and General Finzer intends sending an even stronger team than last summer, when Oregon beat the whole United States, regular army and all, at 1000 yards.

Dr. W. H. Lytle, of Pendleton, state sheep inspector, is in Roseburg on an official visit. Through the efforts of his seven efficient deputies in this county and the co-operation of the herders in complying with the dipping law, Dr. Lytle is able to report that the sheep scab, once so widespread in this county, is now practically eradicated. Out of the some 400 different flocks of sheep in Douglas county in 1907, scab was found to exist in 67 of them. This year however, scab could be discovered in only two flocks and these are now being dipped.

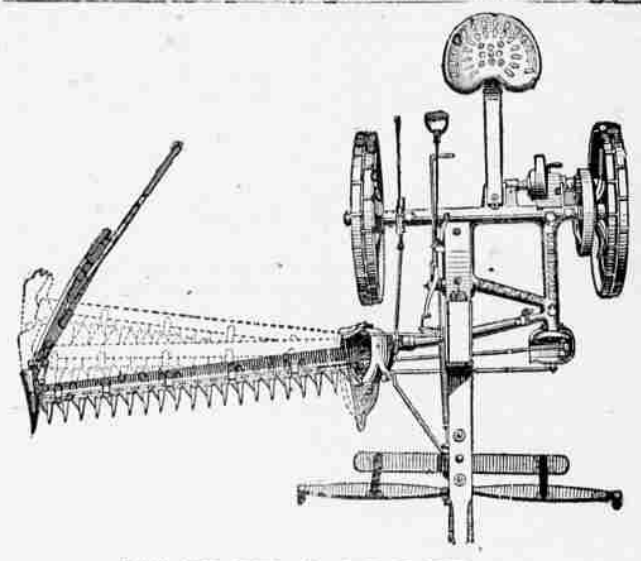
