CAMP AT CHICAMAUGA.

ATLANTA, Ga., July 1.—The quarter of million dollar encampment which congress determined should be held at Chicamauga Park this year begins today, and already many troops are in camp on the historic ground.

The encampment is to last only a month this year. This is due to wisdom learned three years ago. Then it was proposed to have a three-month encampment but before the end the general weariness of everybody brought it to a premature close.

Altogether 12,000 troops will be quartered at Chicamauga during the encampment, but never more than 5,000 at one time. The encampment this year will be very similar to the one of two years ago, except that more time will be given to the solving of tactical problems and less to drilling.
