Under the game laws as they now exist, the open season for bucks begins July 15 and extends to November 1, except in Coos and Curry counties, where the season closes October 15. The open season for does begins September 1 and extends to November 1. In Coos and Curry counties the killing of female deer is prohibited all the year. The bag limit for the season is five deer to each person.
