Portland Journal: Job Gilpin and Louis Kohlhaugen, of Roseburg, indicted by the last federal grand jury on a charge of having filed on land which had already been proved upon as mining claims, filed denunciations to the indictments in the United States district court this morning on the grounds that the evidence is not sufficient. They ask that the indictment be dismissed. Both men are out on bonds. Their trials will not be heard until the fall term of the federal court.

Eugene Guard: Jos. Jacobs, the West Eighth street merchant, who was recently fined \$500 and sentenced to serve thirty days in the county jail for selling liquor in violation of the local option law, today paid his fine and was released from custody, he having served his thirty-day sentence. This sort of penalty has had a salutary effect in doing away with blind pigs in Eugene. It is said that liquor is now hard to secure here, although it is reported that two or three of the "pigs" still exist.

Hobart Hulery left Tuesday for Roseburg, and from there will go down the Umpqua to work on a log drive.

Portland Telegram: Walter Lyon, secretary of the Marshfield Chamber of Commerce, who is now in Portland, said yesterday that great preparations were made at Coos Bay for the deer season opening. Most of the sportsmen of that place were preparing to visit the foothills near the Douglas county line, where deer were reported plentiful. The present period of the open season precludes the killing of does. Any sportsman caught with the carcass of a doe is liable to prosecution, and the game wardens, under Warden R. O. Stevenson, are exceptionally vigilant.

The killing of several elk in the vicinity of Roseburg recently, has stirred the state officials to renewed activity, for elk are protected by law at all seasons of the year, and the deputy wardens are anxious to make an example of some game hog.
