Glenville Collins, a civil engineer of Seattle and representing Seattle capital, has moved with his family to this city and has taken up the preliminary plans for an electric railway from Grants Pass to the Illinois valley, western Josephine county. The colonist rates from all points in the East to all points in Oregon commence Sept. 1 and continue until Oct. 31. It Minor Heir continues to improve as most horses do as they work eastward over the Grand circuit, he will prove the sensation of the season.—Oregonian.
