Dr. E. V. Hoover was called to North Deer Creek this afternoon to attend C. H. Oden, who is reported to have been seriously injured by a barn falling on him.  
Medford Mail: Mrs. J. H. Messier of this city was operated upon at the Gold Hill hospital yesterday by Dr. R. C. Kelley. She stood the operation well and came out from under the effects of the anaesthetic quickly, and is, seemingly, going to get along nicely.
