NEWTON CLARK RESIGNS.

Has Been Recorder of A. O. U. W. For Past 20 Years.

PORTLAND, Or., July 20.—Grand Recorder Newton Clark, of the A. O. U. W., has tendered his resignation, to take effect at the expiration of his present term this month, and one of the important acts of the grand lodge, which meets in Portland tomorrow, will be to elect his successor. It is understood there are a dozen or more applicants, but it is not known at this time, who will be selected.

"I am getting too old to serve longer," Mr. Clark said today. "I am in my 71st year and I shall retire from active life for the remainder of my years. I have been grand recorder for 20 years now, and I think I have a right to rest."

"The order is in the most prosperous condition of its existence, though there was a time when it had about double the number of its present membership, which is a little over 4,000. A few years ago, we were obliged to raise the rates to provide a surplus to draw upon as our order advanced in years, and that raised the effect of driving a number of our young members out. The old ones at that time, however, and we are getting a good proportion of young ones in at present, though little work has been done in soliciting. We have more than \$100,000 on hand and I we meet our death losses instantly."

INVENTS EGG TESTER.

Klamath Falls Genius Starts on Road to Wealth.

KLAMATH FALLS, Or., July 20.—P. B. Southworth, of this city, has invented an egg tester and J. F. Goeller, local millman, has secured the sole manufacture of it in the United States. The invention is a very simple one, consisting of a small wooden box, with a slot for light and plate glass on the bottom.

Mr. Southworth has sold his rights in Oregon, Washington and Idaho to E. E. LaBarr, commission man of Spokane, for \$6,000. Patent was granted in February, 1904, and Mr. Southworth expects to make a fortune from his invention. Special machinery will be installed in the Goeller mill to turn out the egg-testers.

ENGLISH MARATHON RACE.

LONDON, July 21.—With the international Olympic Marathon run but three days away, interest in the event is at a white heat and many wagers are being made on the result. There is no doubt that the contest will be the greatest of its kind in the world's history. Seventy-two of the world's best distance men, representing seventeen nationalities, will engage in Friday's struggle for supremacy. The course is in good condition. It covers a distance of twenty-six and one-third miles, with a start in Windsor Great Park and the finish at Shepherd's Bush Stadium, the scene of last week's Olympic games. The course abounds in twists and turns, varying in distance from a matter of yards to one of miles.


