The forebay for the big water wheels at the Winchester power plant gave way early this afternoon putting the wheels entirely out of commission until repairs can be made. About three hours later the big engine was started and the city lights will be on tonight as usual.

The case of A. L. David against the Southern Pacific Co. is called for trial in Justice Long's court Friday morning at 10 o'clock. Plaintiff is suing for \$35 damages for alleged ruination of a cooking range consigned to the company for shipment from Cottage Grove to Alea last October.

The cases against Denning and Kent, R. B. Mathews, E. Jennings and E. Rhoades, local business men, charged with violating the Sunday closing law, was called in Justice Long's court this morning. Appearing in behalf of Jennings and Rhoades, Attorney O. P. Coshow filed a demurrer, and Attorneys Cardwell and Watson, representing the other defendants, will do likewise this afternoon. In his argument before the court, Mr. Coshow contended that the Sunday closing statute is unconstitutional in that it is class legislation, discriminating against persons engaged in the same line of business. Mr. Coshow also attacked the wording of the charge. The demurrer to be filed by Cardwell & Watson will be practically along the same lines. Justice Long took all four cases under advisement until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.
