Special News: The republican party platform as adopted at Chicago last month is apt to become famous for the planks it failed to adopt rather than for those it did adopt. A political platform and politics for which a principle and politics for which a plank stands and which would be enacted into law should that party be successful at the polls. Yet, it is safe to say, the republican party does not desire to go before the country as being opposed to the election of U. S. senators by the people. Nominate National Ticket and Adopt a Platform.

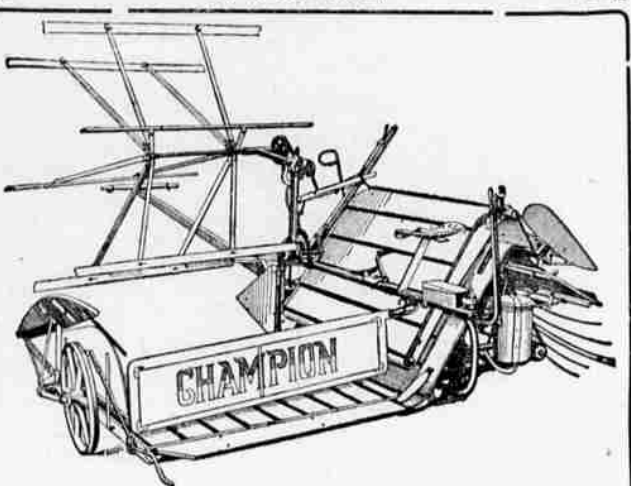
CHICAGO, July 28.—The first ball-

DRY AND DEMOCRATIC.

Primary Elections in Texas Make this Showing.

DALLAS, Tex., July 27.—Returns from the democratic primaries held in Texas yesterday, received up to midnight by the Dallas News, indicate that Governor Campbell has been re-nominated by a majority which will probably reach 100,000, on a vote that is in excess of 200,000.

The only other issue that excited interest was whether the question of a constitutional amendment permitting state-wide prohibition should be submitted to popular vote, and the returns at midnight indicate that this proposition will be carried through, not by so large a majority, however, as indicated by the earlier returns.
