A REAL PANIC.

Losses Heaviest in Our History—Rapidly Improving.

Some people, particularly in the west, wonder if there has been a panic. They should refer to the record and satisfy their curiosity. The record shows that the country has passed through the greatest panic in forty years.

For the first six months of 1908 there were 7560 failures against 7,024 in 1897, and 6,528 in 1894. The liabilities this year are \$172,555,000 against the next highest six months' total in 1893 at \$170,000,000 and \$105,000,000 in 1906.—Commercial West.

Better Times Ahead.

Henry Clews & Co., in their last weekly financial review, say: "The first six months of the year have closed, showing a degree of recovery from the October panic which fully equals, if not surpasses, all reasonable expectations. It has been a period of somewhat painful convalescence but the improvement has been pronounced and substantial, and if sustained for the remaining six months of the year, will go far toward obliterating the effects of last year's disasters. Of course there are many unsatisfactory features still remaining; trade and industry are restricted, and more or less disappointment and discomfort prevail in consequence. Unfortunately it can not be said that the process of readjustment is complete; contradiction has been unduly severe in some directions, and very inadequate in others. Consequently the evening up process must still go on, and additional time will be required before conditions are restored to the normal. On the other hand, it is a matter of congratulation that some very important danger points have been safely passed; a political crisis has been averted. Besides failures have been much less serious than at one time feared, and the credit situation shows vast improvement over a year ago. Financial institutions which fell under the strain of the panic are mostly resumed, and our banks are as a rule now exceptionally strong."

In the foregoing we have a most striking example of the salutary results of united boosting. Statistics now show that the panic of last fall was the most disastrous financially of any in our history. Yet from its inception about 90 per cent of the newspapers and 99 per cent of the newspapers began a system of persistent boosting, stoutly maintaining that the country was all right and the banks in general were all right. It given a little time to gather in their resources. A conspicuous leader in this optimistic effort was Hon. W. J. Bryan, who advised the people to support the banking institutions of the country during the period of depression by being as conservative as possible in their demands upon the banks at that time. Under such conditions the rapid revival of business is not surprising. Imagine, if you can, what the results would have been had the newspapers and prominent men like Mr. Bryan engaged in systematic "knocking," as was done by the republican leaders as well as by thousands of democrats during the Cleveland administration in 1893. Then a national bond issue raised a tremendous howl through out the country. Last fall not only was another bond issue made, but numerous banks were compelled to resort to the issuance of clearing house certificates in order to avert the greatest financial crash the world has ever seen. Had there been a wave of pessimism spread over the country, instead of the united stand taken against it, there is scarcely a bank in the entire country that would have been able to withstand the crash which would have followed. Happily that disaster was averted, and although the financial losses in the east were unparalleled, the business of the country is rapidly resuming its normal basis. Instead of taking years to overcome the depression as was the case when nearly everybody turned "knocker" during the panic of 1893.

FINISH CANAL IN FIVE YEARS.

WASHINGTON, July 31.—In the digging of the Panama Canal it has always been considered that, outside of the construction of the big lock and dam works, the chief difficulty to be encountered is the great cut through the backbone of the American continent at Culebra. The problem was there presented of removing a mountain and the aid of modern steam shovels, drills and dynamite the solution is being rapidly worked out. In fact, according to information which has reached the office of the Isthmian Canal commission here, over one-half of this great work has now been completed.

This great cut through the hills and mountains extends a distance of nine and one-half miles. At the highest point the original surface of the ground was 200 feet and a hole from 430 feet to 1000 feet wide and 160 feet deep is being dug there. This work involved the excavation of 39,698,248 cubic yards of earth and stone. The old French company took out 12,600,000 cubic yards between 1881 and 1889; the new French company took out 19,000,000 cubic yards from 1895 to 1904 and since then the Americans have taken charge of the work they have excavated 18,445,426 cubic yards. This leaves only 39,652,822 cubic yards yet to be removed, less than half of the total. In view of the fact that 11,191,488 yards were taken out last year after the Americans had got their machinery in operation and their organization perfected, the indications are that, at the same rate of progress, the Culebra Cut will be completed in three years and a half.

In the opinion of engineers here that will fix the date for the completion of the entire canal—in other words they think that the work on the other section will be so timed as to be finished at the moment when the excavation is done. If they are correct in this the Panama Canal should be open for business in January, 1912.

NO RACE SUICIDE THERE.

WASHINGTON, July 21.—How ever much, or little, William Jennings Bryan may be worrying President Roosevelt and Judge Taft, there is cause for rejoicing in Oyster Bay and Cincinnati. This is due to the annual report of Governor Wm. F. Pack, of Benguet province, Philippine Islands.

Benguet province is the land of the Igorrote. These native tribesmen were recorded as annihilated until seven years ago—when the Roosevelt administration came in. The report shows that since that time there has been less race suicide among the Igorrotos than among any other people on the face of the earth. Gov. Pack says that during these seven years, the Igorrote population has increased from 12,000 to 20,000. He admits that some tribesmen have come across the border from other provinces, but he proves conclusively that the birth-rate has been steadily increasing. "This is due to additional prosperity and a better mode of living which brings about an effect that the women do not have to work as hard as formerly," explains the governor.
