LAND GRANT SUIT IN 2 WEEKS

Bill in Equity Now Enroute to Atty Gen. Bonaparte.
PORTLAND, Or., Aug. 5.—The bill in equity which is to be filed against the Oregon & California rail road company by the government of Florida in the famous land grant case is to be started on its way to Washington, D. C. this afternoon, when it goes to be approved by Attorney General Charles J. Bonaparte and receive his signature.

The narrative part of the bill covers 68 printed pages and the exhibit about 300 additional pages, making the bill one of the largest ever compiled on the Pacific coast. Approximately there are 75,000 words in the bill.

The bill was mailed to the attorney-general by R. D. Townsend, special assistant to the attorney general, who has been at work gathering evidence and presenting the facts before congress for more than a year. It is expected that the bill will be returned to Portland within the next two weeks, when it will be filed in the United States court.

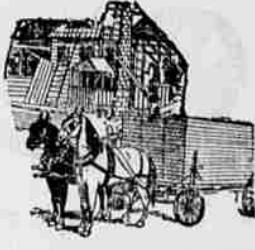
