### TAKES FATHER'S PLACE.

Jeff Heard's Daughter Finds Two Big Nuggets at Sterling Mine.

Medford Tribune: Miss Gladys Heard, the "nugget queen," Wednesday unearthed two large nuggets at the Sterling mine, Jackson county's prize producer and the largest placer mine in the world. One of the nuggets weighs 132 grams and the other 124. She now has quite a collection of nuggets, probably the largest collection in Oregon, some of them three or four inches across, which have been washed into the sluice boxes or picked up in pockets along the bedrock after the earth had been hydraulicked off.

Miss Heard, pretty, charming and still in her teens, is probably the only girl placer miner in the world. Her father, Jeff D. Heard, who is part owner and manager of the Sterling, is away a great deal of the time, and during his absence his daughter runs affairs, managing a crew of 30 or 40 men, giving directions, attending to details and overseeing the cleanups in a businesslike manner that well might excite the envy of a forty-niner. Moreover, she is lucky and the big strikes are made and the nuggets found while she is boss of the mine.

Abraham Sell—the name, it is hoped, has no special significance—is an Acorn farmer and has so improved his own private brand of corn that the stalks have been growing so rapidly that the noise they make resembles a battle. ### SOME STRANGE CROPS.

Marvelous Results Obtained From Crossing Plants.

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 5.—Crop reports from over the state indicate that Pennsylvania farmers will accomplish some remarkable feats during the present year, if the rural correspondents of the Philadelphia papers are to be believed. Stories are coming in by the dozens regarding the products of Pennsylvania disciples of Luther Burbank, and in many instances the "plant wizard" of California is hopelessly distanced.

From Wilkes-Barre comes the veracious story of a wise agriculturist who has perfected a succotash plant by crossing sugar corn with beans. The resulting plant is said to afford a remarkably fine quality of succotash.

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**COWHERD CARRIES MISSOURI.**

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Aug. 5.—With three precincts missing, Jackson county, including Kansas City, gives W. S. Cowherd the democratic nomination for governor by a plurality of 13,000. Here it is estimated that from the returns at hand that his plurality over the state will be about 10,000, or about half of the plurality he received in the cities. David A. Ball will be the second candidate in the race. Ball appears to have received a larger vote than Wallace, who made his campaign on his Sunday enforcement record.

Herbert S. Hadley, of Kansas City, the attorney-general of Missouri, was the only candidate for governor on the republican ticket.

Wallace and Ball showed their greatest strength in the farming district. The cities turned the scale in favor of Cowherd.

All the present Missouri congressmen were renominated except in the Eleventh district, where William T. Findlay, of St. Louis, was named by the republicans to succeed. Congressman H. Caulfield, republican, who was not up for renomination.
