But meager reports have been received here in relation to the big forest fire which has been burning in the mountains beyond West Fork. A few sections are known to have been burned over, however. According to the reports some individuals are setting out the fire about as fast as the rangers and others can quench them. The residents of those localities fear to report the miscreants, being in dread of the possibility that their own property might be the next to suffer. We also learn that there are 14 fires along the road between Canyonville and Tiller, on the upper South Umpqua river. None of these are of large area as yet and very little damage has resulted. It is also said that these fires were purposely started. Many people have the erroneous idea that burning over these lands benefits them for pasture purposes. That might be the case were they immediately sown with grass seed, but that is very seldom done. Douglas county has forests enough, if preserved and cut in a lumber, etc., to make 100 millionaires in the next 10 years, besides making thousands of other people wealthy. Such a valuable resource cannot be too carefully safeguarded, and persons who will wantonly set out fires therein should be everly punished.
