PHILIPPINE VETERANS.

GALESBURG, Ill., Aug. 13.—Galesburg is today entertaining the first national convention of any kind ever held here, and in consequence the delegates to the national encampment of the Society of the Army of the Philippines have been given the freedom of the city and are given to understand that the whole town is theirs. Decorations of a patriotic character abound everywhere and the streets and buildings are swathed in flags and bunting. Several hundred veterans, representing more than a score of states, are taking part in the encampment and renewing friendships and talking over old times when they were soldiering in the Philippines. Several new branches of the society have been formed since the convention of last year, held in Kansas City.

The formal program, which will extend until next Sunday, includes parades, camp fire meetings, banquets, smokers and addresses by prominent men.

MEXICO WANTS HIGH TARIFF.

CITY OF MEXICO, Aug. 13.—A high tariff wall which will shut the manufacturers of the United States and Europe out of Mexico will be demanded by the delegates to an industrial congress, to be held here this fall, the call for which has just been issued. Nearly all of the large manufacturing interests of the republic will have representation at the congress, and will seek to agree upon a protective tariff schedule, which will be presented to the treasury department with a demand for its adoption.

Under the proposed schedule, a prohibitive tariff will be placed upon all goods now extensively manufactured in Mexico, while reductions will be asked upon raw materials used in manufacture.
