ESPERANTO CONVENTION.

Dreamers of Time When All Nations Will Use Same Language.

DRESDEN, Aug. 15.—While German is the language usually spoken in Dresden, few uninitiated visitors to the city would suspect it, since the hotels are filled with delegates to the Fourth International Esperanto congress, opened today. Disciples of the new universal language from all the nations of Europe, with a sprinkling of delegates from the United States and Latin America, are thronging the city. In honor of the visitors, Dresden has been swathed in green, the colors of Esperanto, while the Esperanto flag floats from hundreds of buildings. The green star, the Esperanto emblem of hope, is worn by thousands, and the shopkeepers display in their windows the announcement, "Oml Paroles Esperanto"—Esperanto spoken here.

Never before, perhaps, has there been such a gathering, with turbaned Indian, brown little Japanese, Englishmen, Spaniards, Russians, Germans and Frenchmen, and representatives of a score of other nations and tongues, all conversing volubly in a common speech. And it is small wonder that most of these men and women are enthusiasts who dream of a happy future when all nations speak at peace, bound to each other by the ties of a universal language.

The American delegates are seeking to secure the next international congress, with considerable hopes of success. It is believed that such a gathering would do much toward spreading the language in the United States.

Esperanto from the beginning has been much aided in its progressive march in Europe by the support it has had from prominent men in social, political, professional, scientific, commercial and educational circles, including different kinds of international and benevolent societies.

Just how many Esperantists there are in the world at the present time is as hard to figure out as the number of persons with corns on their toes; nobody really knows, but an estimate of from 750,000 to 1,000,000 Esperantists is not an extravagant one.

It is claimed by the Esperantists that the reading of the language is mastered by very little study and in a few days. To write it well and speedily requires more time. To speak and understand it is, of course, a beginning apparently irksome, and requires daily practice in order to acquire facility. There are thousands and thousands in Europe who speak it as they do their mother tongue.

In sound Esperanto resembles the Italian in smoothness and euphony. The reason in both cases is plain—namely, that words end either in vowels or in "n," "l" or "r" pronouns. Verbs in the active voice end in "s," which is not quite as smooth sounding as the vowels. In a word, you may take a page of Esperanto and you will find that out of every 100 words about 95 of them end either in a vowel or in "l," "n," "s," or "r" ("y"), while the other five, which are generally one-syllabled propositions, end in some other consonant.
