September 1st, and each month thereafter, fully \$25,000 will be distributed among the workmen as wages for the preceding month, which will surely help the business people of the thriving town of Glendale.

LEG BROKEN: SHOT.

Passing of Snark, One of Fastest Running Horses in Oregon.

Snark, one of the fastest running horses ever brought to Oregon, is dead in this city, at the age of 10 years. A kick from a fractious racing mare in Dick Turpin's barn on Monday night broke the upper bone of his right hind leg and he had to be shot. Snark was brought to this city from Grants Pass Monday with the mare that kicked him and which is owned by Al Teal, of that city. Both nags had been together for the past six months and were to have been raced at the district fair at Marshfield next week. Snark was owned by Jacob Fry, of Grants Pass.

Born and raised in New York city, Snark, when three years old, broke the world's record there for 5 1/4 furlongs. Afterwards he was taken to Oakland, Calif., where he passed into the hands of Hornbrook parties. Later he was sold to Sweetland and Smith, of Grants Pass, and about a year ago he was bought by Mr. Fry.

Throughout his entire racing career, Snark, was a consistent performer. He has appeared at many racing meets in this state and won about 9 out of every 10 events in which he was entered. His most notable feat in Oregon was the creation of a new track record at Portland three years ago in the 4 1/2 furlong event. Previously at the state fair Snark won all four races in which he was entered. In one of them he covered a half mile in 47 seconds.

At the last two district fairs in Roseburg, Snark won all of the main events. Last year he won the five-eighths and seven-eighths races, also the derby of 1 mile and an eighth. His time of 54 seconds in the five-eighths dash is the track record.
