WINS TWO CUPS.

Wonderful Scores of Capt. Casey—Boys from Oregon High up.

CAMP PERRY, O., Aug. 19—What is said to have been the most extraordinary long range rifle shooting ever seen in America was accomplished today by Captain K. K. V. Casey, of the First Delaware, in the Leech and Wimbledon cup matches, both of which he won by record-breaking scores. In the Leech match for the cup presented by Captain Leech, of the Irish team which visited New York in 1874, shot at 800, 900 and 1000 yards, Casey scored 104 out of a possible 105. In the Wimbledon 1000-yard match he scored 97, beating the match record of 91, made by Captain Richard, of Ohio, in 1903. Casey won the Wimbledon here last year by the score of 88, under very unfavorable conditions. Today the conditions were as nearly perfect as could be desired.

Other high scores included those of Sergeant A. Q. Johnson, Fourth Oregon, 97, and Sergeant C. Abrams, Third Oregon, 97. Corporal Roman, Third Oregon, 96.

The 1000-yard stage of the regimental championship was not shot today. At the end of the 600-yard stage the leaders ranked as follows: Second New Jersey, 520; Second Massachusetts, 519; Second Ohio, 512; Fifth Maryland, 508; U. S. Navy, No. 2, 507; Third Oregon, 507, and Fourth Oregon, 504.

RETIRES FROM COOS COUNTY.

Pacific States Sells to Company of Local Capitalists.

Marshfield Times: Announcement was made today by R. T. Durrett that he had completed the organization of the Coos Bay Home Telephone Company and that it would take over the lines and exchanges of the Pacific States Telephone Company in Coos and Curry counties on or before September 1. The charter for the new company was received today and was issued by him to R. T. Durrett, J. Virgil Pugh and W. U. Douglas as representing the new company. It was stated that all of the stockholders, aside from Mr. Durrett, are residents of Coos Bay and that while a sufficient number had subscribed for stock to consummate the deal, other local parties would become identified with it.

The deal includes the Coquille, Myrtle Point, Marshfield and North Bend local exchanges and all of the toll lines connecting the various points in the two counties. An agreement has been made with the Pacific States company whereby its long distance lines will be used for toll service to and from points outside of Coos and Curry counties.

The charter granted the Coos Bay Home Telephone Company by the state of Oregon is a perpetual one and fixes the capitalization at \$50,000.

E. L. Parrott, Von Casey, Miss Belle Curry, Miss Rose Parrott and the latter's friend, Miss Mura Richardson, of Eugene, leave Sunday by private conveyance for Crater Lake.

H. L. Messick, an orchardist of Portland, is in Roseburg today looking for a competent man to take charge of his 280-acre portion of the Chenoweth Park fruit ranch near Oakland. Mr. Messick this year raised 150 tons of Bartlett pears and two carloads of prunes on 100 acres of the place. The former fruit he has sold to the Grants Pass cannery and will ship it to that place next Monday. He is now negotiating with E. W. Tillson for the sale of his prunes. Mr. Messick, who is well along in years, has been in the orchard business practically all of his life. He owns a plant at Quincy, Ill., which manufactures a fertilizer of his own concoction, and he estimates that during his career he has planted either for himself or for other parties on contract not less than 1,500,000 fruit trees.
