### RAP'S STANDARD DECISION.

Missouri's Attorney General Speaks in Pointed Language.

DENVER, Aug. 20.—"The judge who cannot see the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey in the Standard Oil Company of Indiana, and who cannot see through both of these legal fictions to the real owners and the real offenders, John D. Rockefeller, H. H. Rogers, John D. Archbold and others, is either blinded by prejudice or by an unfortunate disposition to obscure the merits of a controversy by strained and irrelevant technicalities," declared Attorney General Herbert S. Hadley, of Missouri, today, in his address before the second annual convention of the National Association of Attorneys-Generals, of which he is president.

The statement was made in the course of a review of the reversal by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals of the \$29,240,000 fine which was assessed against the Standard Oil Company of Indiana by Judge Landis, of the United States District Court.

"To assert that men may, by the organization of a puppet corporation, escape the proper measure of punishment for their wrongdoing," continued the attorney general, "is to give to the legal fiction of the corporation greater rights, privileges and immunities than those which belong to natural persons."

"This case should serve as an impressive argument as to the necessity of the national and state governments enacting a law to the effect that no judgment in a criminal or civil case should be reversed unless the court can affirmatively say upon the entire record, that the judgment will be for the wrong party, and that but for the error complained of, a different judgment would have been rendered."

"The results secured, or rather, the lack of results secured," said President Hadley further, "furnish an added demonstration of the ineffectiveness of the present methods of litigation for the suppression of punishment of trusts and monopolies."

### BRUTAL REIGN ENDS.

King Leopold Deprived of Rights to Rule Over the Congo.

BRUSSELS, Aug. 20.—After a bitter struggle of several months, the Chamber of Deputies today adopted the Congo annexation treaty by 53 votes to 55.

Although today's action will probably insure the solution of the Congo problem and put an end to King Leopold's reign of blood, there still remains open the important question of Belgium's financial responsibility.

The personal rule of King Leopold in Africa is now drawing to a close. In the future he will have nothing to do with the state, which is to be administered by Belgium—and the hope is widespread that there will now be an end of the atrocities and maladministration in this part of the world, which for years past has been a subject of investigation and bitter complaint by humanitarians all over the world.

Under the terms of the treaty, there is granted an especial token of gratitude to the King, the sum of \$10,000,000 in 15 annual installments for his use in maintaining hospitals and schools and forwarding scientific work in Africa.

In addition King Leopold retains in fee simple 40,000 hectares of land at Mayumba for coffee and cocoa growing experiments, and during his lifetime he is to enjoy his interest in the Congo concessionary companies and the property in Belgium and France which he purchased out of the funds of the Congo foundation.

Upon the death of the King all this property will revert to Belgium.
