### BRYAN ON BANK ISSUE.

TOPEKA, Kan., Aug. 27.—William J. Bryan will deliver one of the principal speeches of his campaign here today, the subject selected being the guarantee of bank deposits as enunciated in the party platform. Mr. Bryan considers this issue a highly important and vital one and believes that it will appeal to thousands of republican and independent voters. It is stated that a movement has been set on foot to form a national campaign organization of persons who have lost money through bank failures.

Democrats from all parts of Kansas began pouring into the capital this morning to greet the candidate and the Nebraskan will be given a great ovation when he appears on the platform to deliver his address.

### JAPAN TO WELCOME TAIS.

TOKIO, Aug. 27.—A mass meeting of business men, both native and foreign, was held today to raise funds and complete plans for the reception of the American fleet in Japanese waters in October. Admiral Viscount Ito, chief of the naval general staff, is a member of the reception committee. The commercial interests of Tokio will co-operate with those of Yokohama in the entertainment of the fleet at the latter city. It is estimated that \$500,000 will be needed to defray expenses, and a considerable portion of this sum has already been subscribed.

### GRANTING PATENTS.

Invention as Distinguished From Mere Mechanical Skill.  
A patent cannot properly be granted protecting the product of mere mechanical skill as distinguished from invention. Difficulty is frequently experienced in distinguishing between the two, and the supreme test for determining whether a particular device is the result of mechanical skill is not whether an ordinary mechanic could make the device if it were suggested to him, but whether he would make it without suggestions save those which are prompted by his skill and knowledge of his art.

For example, if a man constructs out of iron a machine which had previously been made out of wood he does not thereby become an inventor in a legal sense, because everybody knows that any constructor can build a machine out of iron instead of wood. But suppose that gunpowder had just recently been discovered and that the man who invented it had applied for and obtained a patent upon it.

He might have claimed, "I combine saltpeter, sulphur and charcoal in a certain way and produce a startling result," and it would be no answer, if an action for infringement were brought, for the infringer to say that every chemist could make the powder after he had been shown how, for if every chemist did not have the knowledge as well as the skill, the originating of the powder constituted invention.—Exchange.

### TO FIGHT HIGHER CRITICISM.

OTTAWA, Ont., Aug. 27.—A lively debate between the conservatives and radicals of the Church of England in Canada will likely be precipitated at the session of the General Synod to be held here next month. For some time there has been much opposition among the more orthodox churchmen to some of the advanced teachings of clergymen and college professors. In order that the matter may be threshed out by the synod, the Rev. Dr. Langtry has introduced a motion attacking the "conclusions of what is known as the higher criticism." The "higher critics" and "modernists" within the church will likely oppose the adoption of such a motion, and a verbal warfare may result.
