MARSHFIELD, Or., Aug. 26.—The Southern Oregon District Fair opened today in Marshfield. There was an exceptionally large attendance for the first day and the fair promises to be the largest ever held in the district.

The streets of Marshfield are illuminated at night with colored electric lights and a street carnival company which will be during the week adds to the mirth and merriment. Many from out of town are in attendance, Douglas county being especially well represented.
