W. C. T. U. CONVENTION.

There is a widespread idea or notion in the world that the 13th number is unlucky, but those interested in the convention, which was held in the M. E. Church at Drain, Aug. 19 and 20, will assure you that it was the best ever held in the county.
Wednesday morning, with 23 earnest persons in attendance, the County President, Mrs. Ida Marsters, assisted by the state president, Mrs. Henrietta Brown, of Albany, began the 13th Annual Convention of the Douglas County W. C. T. U. Reports from every union in the county showed so much good work done that it is no wonder we are floating the prohibition banner, for we believe the education the people are receiving from the many departments of our work has a great influence on the voter.
About 60,000 pieces of illustrated literature have been circulated this year and the medal content work, which has been done by Drain and Elkton, has brought to the work \$150.
Prof. Ray Henderson spoke of some "Difficulties," such as non-enforcement of law, the "Near Beer" proposition, unlawful use of the prescription law and the child labor question, which perplexes reform workers.
Mrs. Brown thinks the laws regarding child labor are soon to be enforced and the children will be freed from their present slavery. Prof. Henderson thinks it difficult to have our plans carried out while the government licenses the sale of a drink which is 2 per cent alcohol, in prohibition territory, and will not allow the sale of anything containing over 1/2 per cent without license.
A letter from Mrs. Urah advised us to plan for great things and begin the next day after the convention to carry out our plans.
Drain has a wide-awake union and gave us a hearty welcome.

FLEET NEARING MELBOURNE.

MELBOURNE, Aug. 28.—The American battleship fleet is today nearing Melbourne, having almost completed the 576 mile voyage from Sydney, and will enter the harbor tomorrow to receive the most enthusiastic ovation that the Yankee tars have been accorded since setting forth from San Francisco. The tributes paid to the office and men by Honolulu, Auckland and Sydney will be eclipsed, since Melbourne, as the capital and metropolis of Australia, has been able to raise a larger entertainment fund than any of the other cities.
The fleet will remain here for seven days.
