Albany's Paving Will Cost \$2.60 Per Square Yard on an Average.

Albany (Or.) Herald, Aug. 28: Bids of the Warren Construction Co. for paving four blocks on First street and three blocks intersecting with Second street, were accepted by the council last night at its adjourned meeting.

According to the figures submitted by the paving company it will cost on an average of \$2.60 per square yard to pave.

PETROLEUM PRODUCTION.

Year 1907 Saw Enormous Increase in Output—Kansas Leads.

A total output far in excess of that of any previous year, an unparalleled accumulation of stocks, and high prices for oil of all grades characterized the petroleum industry of the United States in 1907.

The total production of petroleum in this country in 1907 amounted to 165,095,335 barrels, or 22,149,862 metric tons, an increase of 39,601,399 barrels over the production of 1906.

The rank of the leading petroleum states was changed materially during the year. Kansas and Oklahoma, with a production of 45,933,649 barrels in 1907 as against 21,718,648 barrels in 1906, attained first place.

The greatest change, however, was in Illinois, where the increased production from 4,397,059 barrels in 1906 to 24,281,973 barrels in 1907—brought the state from ninth place to third place.

Use of Oil in the Balance. During 1907 a total of 18,855,691 barrels of oil were consumed by the railroads of the United States.

the total length of line covered by oil-burning engines is estimated at 74,197,144 miles, an average of 2.925 miles per barrel of oil consumed.

This country is the greatest oil producer in the world, according to Dr. Day's table showing world production, its output in 1907 being more than 100,000,000 barrels in excess of that of its closest rival, Russia.

CHICAGO, Aug. 28.—All the railroads engaged in interstate commerce have received from the Interstate Commerce Commission outlines of the annual reports that they are required to make up for the year ending June 30.

A few questions which the railroads are required to answer are as follows: Names of the 10 largest holders of securities, whether these are trustees, and for whom.

Names and mileage of all roads whose operations are included in the income account.

Securities issued during the year, for what purpose and cash realized therefor.
