In order to secure an independent telephone service between Myrtle Creek and Roseburg, as well as to increase and extend the influence of the local service, a petition is being circulated here asking for subscriptions to a fund to build a telephone line from here to Roseburg, or to extend it northward to a point where connections can be made with one of the independent lines running south out of Roseburg. Already \$150 has been pledged and evidently no difficulty will be experienced in raising ample funds to fully finance the project.
