Albany Democrat: A marriage license has been issued to Edward McFarland, aged 42, a cigarmaker, born in Ohio; and Myra Elia Tinkle, born in Minn., aged 39, both of Albany. (Mrs. Tinkle is a sister of B. R. Westbrook, of this city, and resided here for several months of last year.)

This morning Rev. Clemo came to Roseburg and had the bullet located by Dr. E. V. Hoover, but it could not be removed without mutilating his hand, so he will carry it for life unless it becomes troublesome, which it not likely.

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FRANK OUT, HENRY IN?

And as State Secretary, Judge Benson Would Succeed Chamberlain.

Portland Telegram, Aug. 31: In resigning as Circuit Judge for Lake, Klamath and Josephine counties, Henry L. Benson took the first step toward becoming acting governor of the state, the second step to be when his brother, Frank Benson, resigns as secretary of state. This is a rumor being circulated and which is alleged to be the inside reason for Judge Benson leaving the bench, his resignation taking effect tomorrow, when he will be succeeded by George Noland, formerly of Astoria.

The report is in circulation that Secretary of State Frank Benson, who is now in California, will tender his resignation to Gov. George E. Chamberlain within two or three months, or, at latest, before the legislature meets. This will leave a vacancy, and the understanding is that Gov. Chamberlain will appoint Frank's brother, Judge Benson, to fill the position, which will not only keep the office of secretary of state in the Benson family, but would be a good political move for those concerned all around.

This deal is said to have been prepared because of Secretary Benson's ill health. The secretary of state has been in the south for several months seeking to recuperate. If the legislature elects Chamberlain United States senator, vice Charles W. Fulton, Frank Benson would succeed to the office of governor.

SPANISH WAR VETERANS.

Annual Encampment Being Held in Boston This Week.

BOSTON, Sept. 1.—Another historic gathering was added to the long list that have been held in Faneuil Hall when the fifth annual encampment of the United Spanish War Veterans was called to order this morning. The meeting marks the tenth anniversary of the war with Spain and is one of the most largely attended in the history of the body. Delegates are here from every state in the union and from the Philippines, Hawaii and Alaska. Following the formal opening program, the encampment adjourned and most of the visitors will spend the afternoon in excursions and sight-seeing.

The big event of the encampment will be tomorrow's parade, in which it is expected that 10,000 veterans of the army and navy will take part. Special divisions in the parade will be provided for the survivors of the Maine, the men who fought with Dewey at Manila, the crew that entered Santiago in the Merrimack with Hobson and the crew that cut the cable at Cienfuegos.
