## BRYAN'S TEXT BOOK OUT.

CHICAGO, Sept. 4.—The campaign textbook of the democratic party, prepared with the approval of the national committee, will be distributed tomorrow morning to party workers and others interested. It contains 300 pages, in a bright cover, and is replete with arguments on the various issues of the campaign. The platforms of the democratic and republican parties arranged in parallel columns occupy much space in the manual, which also contains important utterances of both democratic and republican leaders.

Some of the chapter headings of the volume are: "Pointers on the Republican National Platform," "Figures of Thistles," "A Discredited Slogan," "The Struggle With Monopoly," and "Let Us Forget."  
William J. Bryan's speech of acceptance, his tariff speech and his speech on guaranteed deposits occupy a prominent place in the book, which closes with a detailed index of contents.

## EXPERIMENTAL PARCELS POST.

Word comes from Washington that Postmaster General Meyer expects to obtain an appropriation at the next congress of about \$10,000 to establish an experimental parcels post rural route. Postoffice officials believe that when this route is in operation one year the report therefrom will have such weight that congress will be induced to authorize its extension to every rural route in the United States. They think its success will ultimately rival, if not surpass, the success of free delivery.

The sum of \$25,573,000 is available for maintaining and extending the rural free delivery service throughout the United States. This is the largest sum yet appropriated for the purpose, the first appropriation being \$10,000 a little more than 10 years ago to establish an experimental route. The \$25,573,000 is distributed among 39,145 carriers, and a small portion of it is used for jerks in charge of sub-stations, for tolls and for ferry charges.—Ex.

## TARIFF REVISION PROMISE.

Taft Will Convene Congress in Extra Session, if Elected.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 5.—An extra session of congress will certainly be held immediately on the adjournment of the regular session.  
This statement was made today by Senator McCumber, of North Dakota, who has just come to Washington after conferences with the president and Mr. Taft on this subject. Not only will the extra session be held, the senator said, but the tariff will be revised.

"Among the important articles which the west will demand shall be placed on the free list," said Senator McCumber, "are lumber and coal. A fight will be made to conserve the raw materials that enter into the manufacture by putting them on the free list. The effort is to be made to put on the free list such articles as iron, lumber and coal, the constant consumption of which tends to exhaust the supply."

Residence of the great northwest has hitherto bitterly opposed suggestions looking to free lumber but it is the opinion of Senator McCumber that in regions where lumber is fast becoming scarce the idea is becoming fixed that if the American markets could be opened to the Canadian lumber supply there would be a material reduction in prices.

Although he does not share the opinion that such a reduction in price would follow the admission of free lumber, Mr. McCumber does think that many evils could be avoided by taking that commodity from the dutiable list and it will be his purpose to support this policy in the senate this winter when the extra session is called.

So far as the east is concerned, Mr. McCumber is of the opinion that manufacturers in that section will also make a great effort to get wool and hides on the free list. This, he said, the west would undoubtedly oppose with all its power.  
"It is my opinion," the senator said, "that we shall be in Washington all spring and possibly a good part of the summer if the eastern and western interests fight each other in the extra session."

## CHISHOLM, MINN., IN ASHES.

Loss is \$1,750,000—Other Districts Suffer Heavily.

DULUTH, Minn., Sept. 6.—After destroying the town of Chisholm, on the Mesaba range, and burning over thousands of acres in St. Louis, Carlton and Itasca counties, in Minnesota, and the north portion of Douglas county, Wisconsin, the many forest fires which have been raging in these districts were checked today, and if the wind does not spring up again, it is not likely that further damage will be great.  
The fire subsiding enabled the inhabitants of Buhl and Neshawk to save their towns.

Chisholm presents a scene of ruin and desolation. The only buildings remaining are the new \$125,000 high school, the grade school, the Catholic church, the Italian church and a dozen dwellings in the southernmost parts of the town, which were saved by a few heroic fire fighters who stuck to their posts in the face of the cyclonic onslaught of the flames and smoke.

Loss Will be \$1,750,000.  
The damage to property is estimated at \$1,000,000 and the personal property at \$750,000, including the stocks of the merchants. H. A. Hibbing, an insurance man who had many policies on property in the destroyed town, estimates the insurance carried by Chisholm merchants at \$500,000. The total number of people rendered homeless will reach 12,000 and vast tracts of agricultural lands have also been devastated.
