The court holds that the company did not do an interstate business although a line passed through Pomona points outside the state.

From the decision it appears that cities have an absolute right to dictate to corporations in the matter of the use of their public thoroughfares.

### GRANGE FAIR AT GRESHAM.

Extensive Preparation Being Made for Oct. 6 to 10.

Preparations for this year's Grange Fair and Festival, to be held at Gresham, Oregon, October 6-10, are being pushed rapidly forward and the exhibits and other attractions promise to surpass the splendid fair and carnival of last year.

A beautiful site of nine acres has been secured and is being laid out for a park. Workmen have begun the erection of the buildings. The pavilion will be 60x150 feet, two stories. It will be well constructed and floored, affording nearly three times the exhibit room of last year's temporary pavilion which was overcrowded with exhibits. A large poultry-house and stock sheds will be built, besides a grandstand, office, etc.

With new grounds, new and substantial buildings, and permanent financial backing, every citizen of Portland and of the surrounding country has reason to expect a great fair at Gresham and the management is determined to bring it about.

A Grange Fair Association with a capital stock of \$5000 has been incorporated and over half the stock subscribed. The board of directors consists of fifteen persons, selected from different parts of the patronizing territory of the fair. These are all representative citizens and many of them specialists in some line of farming. With this backing the success of this year's exhibit at Gresham for five days, Oct. 6-10, is assured.

### BATTLE WITH FIRE.

Hibbing and Grand Marais Threatened With Destruction.  
DULUTH, Minn., Sept. 8.—Hibbing, the largest and most prosperous town on the Mesaba Range, with 10,000 to 12,000 people, is threatened with destruction by fire. Every place of business in the town is closed and the men are all out fighting the flames.  
Unless the wind changes, Colvaine and Bovey will be safe from the fire, for the present, at least. Grand Marais, Minn., on the north shore, is in the clutches of the fire demon. The 1000 people are in worse straits than the Range people, in that they have no place to flee to. Forest fires are raging within a mile of the town. Settlers in the country along the north-shore are walking into Grand Marais, burned and exhausted, with packs of their most valuable belongings on their back and their families dragging wearily along behind them. The woods are as dry as tinder, as there has been no rain in the north-shore country for 14 weeks. The fire is rushing down upon the town in great bounds.
