NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.

The last half of taxes due for the year of 1907 will be delinquent after Monday, October 5, 1908.

Delinquent taxpayers will take notice that delinquent taxes will not be advertised as a forfeiture; under a law passed by the legislature of this state taxes that are delinquent after the expiration of six months from the first date of such delinquency may be paid by any one demanding to pay same and a certificate of delinquency will be issued to such party.

Section 37, of said law, in part, reads:

"Any day after the expiration of six months after taxes charged against real property are delinquent the tax collector shall have the right, and it shall be his duty, upon demand and payment of the taxes, penalty and interest to make out and issue a certificate or certificates of delinquency against such property."

Section 38, in part, reads:

"Certificates of delinquency shall bear interest from the date of issuance until redeemed at the rate of 15 per cent per annum."

Delinquent taxpayers are therefore advised that if they have not paid at least one-half of their taxes on or before the first Monday in April that the same are delinquent and have been delinquent since said first Monday in April, and those who have paid one-half of their taxes as above the remaining one-half will become delinquent after the first Monday in October, and six months from such date a certificate of delinquency bearing fifteen per cent interest per annum may be issued against your property.

To save further costs, penalties and interest you are earnestly requested to settle the same at once.

Wonderful Sagacity of Collie Whose Mate Falls Into a Well.

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 16.—Thomas Jones, who owns a big ranch on San Juan Island, is also the owner of a pair of collies, male and female, which no money can buy. About a month ago the female disappeared and for several days a search was kept up for her, but without avail. He came to the conclusion that she had been poisoned or stolen.

Last week Mr. Jones killed a sheep and tossed a large bone to the other collie. Instead of gnawing it he picked it up and started for the woods, looking back, apparently to see if he was followed.

Mr. Jones decided to follow him. The dog trotted along for about a mile, and stopped at the mouth of an abandoned well. Dropping the bone, he leaped and a muffled bark was heard in reply. Then the dog picked up the bone and dropped it over the edge into the well. Mr. Jones got a ladder and climbing down into the well found the lost collie at the bottom, enjoying the meal her mate had just brought her.

There was only a couple of inches of water in the well, but the lost dog would certainly have starved to death had it not been for the other dog, which had brought her food for 24 days, the length of time she had been missing. As it was, she was in good condition, considering her long confinement.

Eugene Guard: Mrs. Amanda Hixson today began suit in the circuit court against her husband, Jack Hixson, for divorce, charging cruel and inhuman treatment. She alleges that at one time he destroyed their marriage certificate by burning it, that at various and numerous times he cursed her and called her vile and indecent names, falsely accused her of being unchaste and unfaithful to him, but the worst of all is, so she alleges, that he compelled her to work in the hay and harvest field, while she was in a delicate condition, compelling her to shock hay and bundles of grain and to do other hard work, causing her great physical suffering, impairing her health and endangering her life.
