## RICH COAL STRIKE.

SILVERTON, Or., Sept. 18.—Having completed an 8x10 foot shaft at Scott's Mills last evening, miners reached a five-foot vein of coal about 800 feet below the surface. Hundreds of people witnessed the last carload of dirt which covered the excellent vein of coal, as it was taken up out of the shaft. There is much rejoicing over the company's success in developing what gives promise of being a valuable property.

A little more than a year ago prospecting was commenced at Scott's Mills and so well pleased was the company with its findings after having sunk a drill several hundred feet that no hesitancy was manifested in the expenditure of nearly \$50,000 in the development of the property, and today the mine is well equipped with all necessary machinery. Experts are confident that the vein extends several miles back in the mountains and are certain that they have developed one of the richest coal mines in this part of Oregon.

Another drill was sunk a few weeks ago on the Abiqua river near this city by the same company and this will be developed as soon as the Scott's Mills mine is well under progress. It is believed that the vein near Silvertown can be reached at a less depth than that at Scott's Mills.

Good Roads Movement Progressing. Postoffice department officials are enthusiastic over the movement in some of the larger states of the Union for the improvement of the highways, and it is claimed that the liberal appropriations for the rural free delivery service have stimulated this movement. From information being received at the department, it is believed by the officials that highway improvement will be stimulated in all the more thickly settled states as rapidly as the rural delivery is extended, and one of the conditions for establishing a new route is that the roads must be in good condition. It is claimed also that the service is enhancing greatly the value of farm property.

Will Lay Three Grades of Gravel Roads. In order to get the greatest possible benefits at the least possible expense gravel roads in Grand Rapids, Mich., will hereafter be divided into three classes—those designed to carry the heaviest traffic for which gravel roads are considered as suitable, those of medium traffic and the little used roads of the outlying districts. For these streets three grades of gravel will be used, varying in the percentage of stone which they carry and the care with which the material is screened.

## NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.

The last half of taxes due for the year of 1907 will be delinquent after Monday, October 5, 1908. Delinquent taxpayers will take notice that delinquent taxes will not be advertised as heretofore; under a law passed by the last legislature of this state taxes that are delinquent after the expiration of six months from the first date of such delinquency may be paid by any one demanding to pay same and a certificate of delinquency will be issued to such party.

Section 27, of said law, in part, reads:

"Any day after the expiration of six months after taxes charged against real property are delinquent the tax collector shall have the right, and it shall be his duty, upon demand and payment of the taxes, and interest, to make out and issue a certificate or certificates of delinquency against such property," and section 38, in part, reads:

"Certificates of delinquency shall bear interest from the date of issuance until redeemed at the rate of 15 per cent per annum."

Delinquent taxpayers are therefore advised that if they have not paid at least one-half of their taxes on or before the first Monday in April that the same are delinquent and have been delinquent since said first Monday in April, and those who have paid one-half of their taxes as above the remaining one-half will become delinquent after the first Monday in October, and six months from such date a certificate of delinquency bearing fifteen per cent interest per annum may be issued against your property.

To save further costs, penalties and interest you are earnestly requested to settle the same at once.
