Work is rapidly nearing completion on the new store rooms occupying the first floor of the Kohlhaugen building. The south apartments to be occupied by Harth's Foggery, will be occupied early the coming week. This store has the distinction of having the largest single sheet of plate glass in its windows to be seen in this city. This glass is 8 by 16 feet in size and is of splendid quality. Its equal is not often seen even in the large cities. Very large and handsome plate glass windows are also being placed in the other apartments, to be occupied by Hunsaker & Guest's grocery store. They expect to move in about Oct. 1st. Above the big plate glass show windows in both stores fancy corrugated glass is being used, the total cost for glass in the two frontages being about \$1000. PACKING HOUSES OPEN.

Operations for the season's run have begun at the prune packing house of E. W. Tillson & Co., 16 North Roseburg. Prunes are beginning to arrive and the packing and shipping will begin right away. A new boiler and other equipment was put in there during the summer and the plant put into first-class condition for the season's run. The prune crop is generally good throughout the county and the operations at the packing house will probably continue for at least three or four months.

Concurrently with that above mentioned, the big packing house of H. S. Gille & Co., under the personal supervision of R. L. Gille, is also ready for starting the season's run. Considerable new machinery has also been installed there and a large quantity of fruit will be handled. Both of these companies have houses and packing plants in Salem and together they handle several millions of pounds of evaporated prunes annually.

Pear shipments are almost completed at the Douglas County Fruit Association's packing house at the S. P. depot in this city and carload shipments of apples will soon begin. This association is handling a large quantity of fresh fruits and berries this season. It is operated by the growers themselves and has proven especially valuable to the producers whose output was not large enough to justify separate shipments.

The L. French Co.'s packing house at Myrtle Creek, and the Hellwell Bros. cannery at Yoncalla, also are important factors in handling the increasing fruit output of Douglas County.

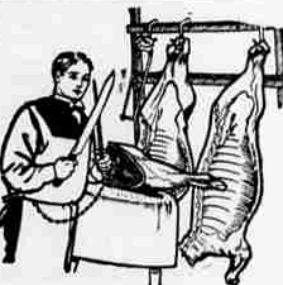
