JEWISH NEW YEAR 5669.

NEW YORK, Sept. 25.—The setting of the sun this evening ushers in the celebration of Rosh Hashanah, or the Festival of the New Year. This is the beginning of the year 5669 of the Hebrew calendar, which is traditionally supposed to count from the creation of the world. The festival is observed by the reformed and orthodox alike, except that the former observe one and the latter two days. It is a season of rejoicing, and many families become reunited during its celebration.

While New Year's day services are of a solemn character, as are the 10 days that follow, the most solemn day of the year is Yom Kippur, or the Day of Atonement, which will come as a climax to the ten days of penitence.

The Jewish calendar contains two New Year days. Rosh Hashanah is held by tradition to be the day on which God created the earth. It falls in September or October of the Christian year, being reckoned by the new moon of the seventh month, Tishri. Abib is the first month in the religious year, and corresponds with March or April, the year dating from the moon after the vernal equinox. The prophets speak of the sacred year, while those in secular employment reckon it by the civil. Different from the ordinary conception Rosh Hashanah has a deep religious significance. It is called, in the Bible, the day of Remembrance, the day of judgment and the day of blowing the shofar, or trumpet. It is more than anything else really a preparation for the great Yom Kippur, or Day of Atonement.

The days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are known as the awful days, or the ten days of penitence, each of which is observed as a half-fest day by the more orthodox Jews, while the Yom Kippur itself is invariably observed as a complete fast.

The rabbinical allegory that on Rosh Hashanah God commands the recording angel to open the books of each one's sins and merits, leaving the record open to be finally closed and irrevocably closed on the Yom Kippur, indicates at once the significance of the day and the appropriateness of calling the New Year the day of remembrance, judgment and of blowing the shofar.

The Succoth, or the Feast of the Tabernacles, which corresponds with the Christian Thanksgiving, concludes the cycle of holy days with a week's celebration, and, as in all such cases, the first and last days of the observance are marked by religious services. This week is really the thanksgiving festival which is largely analogous to the modern harvest festival.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.

The last half of taxes due for the year of 1907 will be delinquent after Monday, October 5, 1908.

Delinquent taxpayers will take notice that delinquent taxes will not be advertised as heretofore; under a law passed by the last legislature of this state taxes that are delinquent after the expiration of six months from the first date of such delinquency may be paid by any one demanding to pay same and a certificate of delinquency will be issued to such party.

Section 37, of said law, in part, reads:

"Any day after the expiration of six months after taxes are charged against real property are delinquent the tax collector shall have the right, and it shall be his duty, upon demand and payment of the taxes, penalty and interest, to make out and issue a certificate or certificates of delinquency against such property," and section 38, in part, reads:

"Certificates of delinquency shall bear interest from the date of issuance until redeemed at the rate of 15 per cent per annum."

Delinquent taxpayers are therefore advised that if they have not paid at least one-half of their taxes on or before the first Monday in April that the same are delinquent and have been delinquent since said first Monday in April, and those who have paid one-half of their taxes as above the remaining one-half will become delinquent after the first Monday in October, and six months from such date a certificate of delinquency bearing fifteen per cent interest per annum may be issued against your property.

To save further costs, penalties and interest you are earnestly requested to settle the same at once.

ALBANY GETS CANNERY.

H. S. Gile, of Salem, One of Owners
—Commercial Club Aids

ALBANY, Or., Sept. 24.—A big fruit cannery for Albany is assured by the action of the Albany Commercial Club last evening. The club agreed to pay half of the purchase price of the site for a plant, which will be erected by J. H. Moore, of Albany, and H. S. Gile, of Salem.

The proposed plant will have a capacity of 10,000 cans of fruit and will be in operation in time to handle the crop of next spring. It is planned to steadily enlarge the output until a capacity of 50,000 cans is realized. The cannery will devote its work to fruit exclusively. Moore has been planning the establishment of the plant for some time and appeared before the Commercial Club last evening with a proposition to build a 10,000 plant if the club would pay half of the purchase price of \$1800 for the site selected.
