should sever your connection with that party and connect yourself with the party that promises better service to your country (Applause).

"The Democratic party, my friends, under the leadership of Mr. Bryan, is still standing on the principles on which this Republic was founded—that all men are created equal in rights and in justice. The Republican party makes riches the standard of equality. The Democracy is the corner stone of individual liberty. The Democratic party still believes that all government derives its just power from the consent of the governed. The Democratic party believes that the governed should govern. This great principle is being carried into full effect in the state of Oregon. Down in Oklahoma he believes in that principle, and let me say that Oklahoma is proud to have followed in the footsteps of Oregon. We believe in that principle so strongly that we advocate the election of United States senators by the direct vote of the people. In the Republican national convention in Chicago that principle was voted down by a vote of seven to one. Do you believe in the election of senators by the direct vote of the people or do you not? If you believe in that principle vote the Democratic ticket, vote with the party that represents your principles.

"The Democratic party believes in an indestructible Union of indestructible states. You can not have one without the other in its full progress and glory. When you destroy the states you destroy the Union. The Democratic party is opposed to the dissolution of the Union. The Democracy believes in the United States of America, the Republican party in the United Trusts of America. The Democratic party still believes in preserving intact the three powers of government, the legislative, the judicial and the executive. No President, however big the stick he wields, is big enough to invade either of the other departments of government. The Democratic party does not believe in the old world doctrine that the King can do no wrong. We do not believe in political Holy Rollers. Suppose that some one would advocate that the president could do no wrong. Why, he would be an immediate candidate for the already overflowing Annals Club. Supposing that some one would advocate that Congress could do no wrong, with such distinguished Americans as Mr. Platt, Mr. Dewey and myself. And Uncle Joe Cannon in line with 'nothin' doin'.' Why, when Uncle Joe assembles his Congress in the capital of the United States, the Republicans are put through their paces like trick mules at a circus without either protest or braying. 'Stand-pat, nothin' doin'.' (Applause). Now, I want to say to every laboring man in this city that he ought not to vote for any Republican nominee for Congress that will not promise not to vote for Paule Joe Cannon for Speaker. He is the arch enemy of labor. You can not move until he is removed.

"Now, my friends, the Democratic party believes that it is wrong for any man to get without earning. The Democratic party believes that it is wrong for any man to earn without getting. The Republican party is in favor of both. Now, my friends, mark this—whatever any man gets without earning, or whatever any man earns without getting is wrong. The Democratic party has always stood against the centralization of wealth in the hands of a few. The Democratic party stands against the centralization of political power, against the centralization of industrial power. It is opposed to both forms, the Republican party favors both forms. Which side are you on?"

"Senator La Follette, the greatest Republican in the nation, and the greatest Democrat, too, outside of the Democratic party, said that during the last four years 440 industrial combinations were organized in the United States, and they are multiplying today like the stars in the Heavens to rife the cradle and rob the tomb, to tax the swaddling clothes of the infant and lay their hands upon the cerements of the dead. They would, if they could, put a meter upon the breast of the mother and tax the hungry infant so much per gram.

"Where do these trusts come from? We want to know under whose administration and under whose policies they have sprung into being. During the last eleven years more trusts have been organized than have ever existed from Pharaoh to Theodore; from Rome to Roosevelt; more trusts than have ever existed since the forming of the stars of creation. They say that the present administration is unfriendly to the trusts. Had it been friendly I wonder how many more would have been organized. Where is this legion of trusts that have been buried, where is the burying ground. Show me their grave. I want to erect a monument over their graves, and weep tears of joy above their ashes.

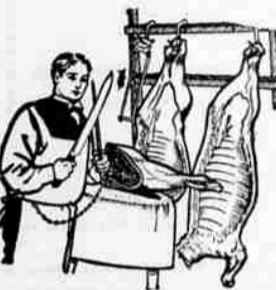

### MORE RECRIMINATIONS.

Big Politicians Continue to Severely Revile Each Other.

GUTHRIE, Okla., Sept. 28.—Governor C. N. Haskell, who on Saturday resigned as treasurer of the Democratic National committee, declared here today that he "will have a new chapter daily on President Roosevelt from now on showing him to be the greatest crook that ever sat in the president's chair.

"My resignation was voluntary," the governor asserted. "I cannot afford if Bryan is defeated to have the democrats say he would have won out but for my connection with the national committee. I am here to look after my case."

Addressing a big crowd yesterday, Haskell referred to Roosevelt as an "infamous liar." He announced that he would start lawsuits for damages this week against W. R. Hearst and a number of Oklahoma parties.

Hearst Not Yet Done.

CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 28.—Passing through here on his way to Denver today, W. R. Hearst said he had more letters proving his charges against Haskell. These, he said, he would read at the proper time.

N. Y. World Raps Bryan.

NEW YORK, Sept. 28.—The New York World, which is supporting Bryan, today criticized his conduct of the campaign editorially, declaring that when Bryan insisted he was the heir of the Roosevelt policies, he gave the president the opportunity he was looking for. The World says: "When Roosevelt's denunciation helped to precipitate the financial panic last fall, Bryan assisted him by throwing the blame upon the 'malefactors of great wealth.'"

Pettigrew Springs One.

MITCHELL, S. D., Sept. 28.—Former United States Senator Pettigrew today sprung a sensation in the national campaign by saying that four years ago the republican national committee, through a former associate in the senate, offered him \$10,000 to desert Bryan and make speeches for Tom Watson, the Populist candidate for president. Pettigrew issued this statement after a conference with W. J. Bryan.

Seattle's Who's Who.

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 28.—A dispatch from Walla Walla to local papers says that Levi Ankeny, who was defeated at the recent republican primaries by W. L. Jones for the U. S. senatorial nomination, does not intend to continue the fight in the legislature.

Dubois is Beaten.

BOISE, Idaho, Sept. 28.—Anti-Mormon agitation has been made a dead issue in Idaho for the present

campaign, at least, by a decision of the Supreme Court today, sustaining the anti-Dubois faction in the contest to determine which of the two tickets nominated at the Wallace conventions is entitled to be placed on the general election ballot.

The petition for a writ of mandamus compelling the secretary of state to place the Dubois ticket on the official ballot is headed by Moses Alexander, candidate for governor, and the platform denounces the war against the Mormons.

### GREAT EVANGELIST COMING.

It was announced yesterday at the Christian church that S. M. Martin, a noted evangelist, will be in Roseburg to begin a series of meetings Oct. 4, one week earlier than first reported.

He has just closed a very successful meeting at Los Angeles, Calif., with over 140 additions. It is to be remembered that he held a successful meeting of 108 additions at Eugene last spring.
