## A Trick With a Shirt Waist--

It solves the problem of how to put on a shirt waist with buttons in the back and to do it without the assistance of a maid. Put the waist on with the opening in front, without putting the arms into the armholes. Then close the neck and pin it evenly. Next button down about three buttons, then turn the waist around to its proper place. Lifting the waist up about the neck, slip the arms through into the sleeves. ### CONDEMN "UNCLE JOE."

CHICAGO, Sept. 30.—Speaker Joseph G. Cannon will be bitterly condemned in resolutions to be presented at the Rock River conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, which begins its sixty-ninth annual session today, with Bishop T. B. Neely of New Orleans presiding. Prominent Methodists here declare that the conference will attempt to make the church denunciation of Cannon a national issue. The committee on temperance and prohibition, it is stated, is in charge of the anti-Cannon resolutions. The Rock River conference is composed of 350 ministerial members, representing a lay membership of 62,000. At Republican headquarters the Methodist attack on Cannon is not considered seriously and it is stated that the sage of Danville is "well able to take care of himself."

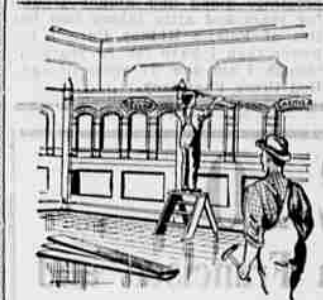
Funeral services and interment occurred at Cleveland today.
