Besides her husband, Mrs. Beckley is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Settle, and a brother, Ed. Settle.

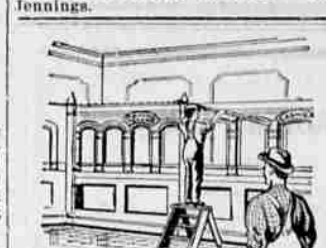
