**How to Cure Cold Sores.**  
Besides being more or less painful and annoying, a cold sore is most debilitating to the face and mouth. The best way in which to cure this painful little blister is to moisten it with camphor to dry it up. Peroxide of hydrogen also is an excellent remedy, and it may be applied by moistening a piece of absorbent cotton with the camphor and then dabbing it on the sore, or else it may be applied with the tip of the finger. If a scab forms for any reason, cold cream should be applied liberally to keep it soft and to prevent it from leaving a scar. One always should be careful to prevent a cold sore from cracking or splitting open.

**How to Cure Hairy Arms.**

If there is not sufficient hair to warrant this cure, use pure peroxide of hydrogen on the arms to bleach the hair. Equal parts of peroxide and ammonia diluted to half the strength with water will bleach the hair and if persistently used will in time kill the coats. However, there are not many like this course enough to withstand this treatment.

### ENCAMPMENT RESOLUTIONS.

Chief Patriarch, Officers and Patriarchs of Union Encampment, No. 9, I. O. O. F.:

We, your committee, appointed to offer Resolutions of Condolence on the death of Patriarch Robert Robertson, G. H. P., most respectfully submit the following:

Reputation is what a man is said to be, but Character is what he really is. In the name or reputation a man wears we find the label of what is within. Some shipments are made under false labels, but well we know that Patriarch Robertson truly bore a splendid label, which always stood for Principle and Character. His Character was the platform on which his life work was transacted. It stood the test of years, and even the clouds of death cannot dissipate the effect of such a life as his.

A sudden stroke of pain and sorrow came heavily upon us on Saturday night, Sept. 19, 1908, when it was announced that Patriarch Robertson was dead. Though previously fearing that the end might come soon, we were unprepared for it, for the world is never ready to lose a good man. A significant thing in this disaster is that Patriarch Robertson fell to his last sleep while literally in the purgation of the path of duty, being stricken by death while on his way to the regular meeting of Philatelian Lodge, No. 8, I. O. O. F. In a few moments many of those by whom he was loved gathered at the scene of sorrow, evincing by their kind attention to his stricken body and faithful service to his sorrowing family the warm attachment they felt for their fallen leader.

While always agreeable among his associates, the keynote of Patriarch Robertson's successful leadership, no doubt, was justice. Justice tempered with charity will make any man strong among his fellows. His faithful service in the City Council was truly an index to his patriotic feeling toward his own people. Recognition of that service was accorded by the formal attendance of the Council in a body at his funeral.

As to his lodge work, every Patriarch knew him so well in that capacity that any extended recital of it here is superfluous. To Odd Fellowship the passing away of so wise and so good a man, at his comparatively early age, is a loss beyond conception. When he had a duty to perform he overcame himself and did it cheerfully, wisely and well. We heartily commend the noble ambition and faithful persevering service which advanced him step by step until he had reached the exalted position of Grand High Priest of the Grand Encampment, I. O. O. F. of Oregon, and in less than another year would have gained for him the highest office in the gift of that Grand Body.

According to the ways of men the spirit has taken flight to rest elsewhere, as to the dust the familiar form is assigned. The spirit has gone to its God, only the memory of the one and the moral force of the other remaining with us. The stronger ties in the home being severed makes the loss there felt more keenly than can elsewhere be realized, except by those whose hearts have been pierced by the same sharp sword of death. We can speak the tender word of comfort, shed the tear of sincere sympathy, but we cannot banish the shadow of our loss. Yet through the rifted clouds the sunbeams of hope have pencilled on the horizon of our lives the prospect that we shall meet again. This is especially comforting to the sorrowing wife and loving children. Realizing all this, be it therefore
