TO FLY ACROSS CHANNEL.

Prize of \$10,000 and Gold Cup for Aviators.

LE MANS, France, Oct. 7.—Ten thousand dollars and a gold cup worth \$250 now await the first aviator who crosses the English channel in an airship of any kind heavier than air. Part of the \$10,000 is offered by the London Daily Mail and part by a big French champagne firm. The Aeroplane Society furnishes the cup.

Now that Wilbur Wright's performance in carrying a passenger 42 miles in one flight has finally accomplished the last of Lazare Weiller's conditions, he says that probably he will soon try a flight over the channel by the way of Dover and Calais. Three other aeronauts, declare N. Bleriot, are ready for the same test. All will begin their trials within a fortnight, though it is generally conceded that none has much chance against Mr. Wright.

SUSLAW WANTS HELP.

Florence Board of Trade Ask Aid of Commercial Congress.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 7.—While comparatively few delegates were present at the second day's session when the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress was called to order this morning, nearly every one of the early arrivals were provided with one or more resolutions, and the first hour was devoted to reading and explaining matters on which it is expected the congress will go on record. Resolutions were introduced today which cover a wide range of subjects, including one by Secretary Wastell, of the Oregon and Washington Lumbermen's association, urging an amendment to the interstate commerce act authorizing the commission to suspend and investigate advances in freight rates upon the proper complaint before they become effective.

By George C. Congdon, of Seattle, "urging trans-continental railroads to grant one-way round trip to the Alaska Yukon-Pacific exposition." By Peter Loggie, of North Bend, Or., "urging appointment of a board of federal engineers to revise the projects for the improvement of Coos Bay, with a view of fortifying the entrance and establishing a coaling station."

By the Board of Trade of Florence, Oregon: "recommending appropriations for the improvement of the Siuslaw harbor, Oregon."

To Encourage Railroad. Eugene Guard: The Lane County Asset Company filed articles of incorporation with the county clerk this afternoon. The principal office of business is Eugene, and the capital stock is \$10,000. The incorporators are F. E. Dunn, Alton Hampton and Joseph Fellman, well known merchants of this city. There are other prominent citizens interested in the company.

Attorney A. F. Campbell, who drew up the articles of incorporation and who is interested in the company, when asked by a reporter concerning the objects of the corporation, stated that it was simply to assemble assets together to induce capital to invest in Lane county. It is for the general advancement of the county, especially the western portion.

"It is not the intention of the company," he said, "to enter into the construction of any railroads, canals or anything of the sort, but to assemble assets and be in a position to assist capitalists who may wish to come here for that purpose."
